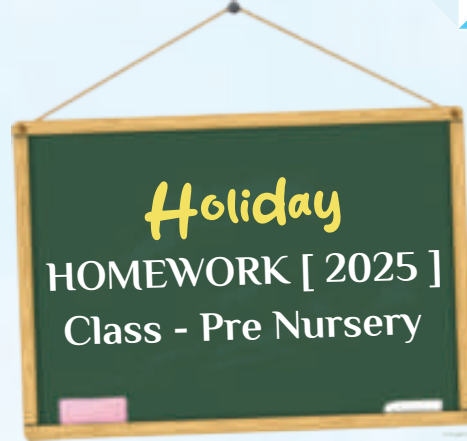

- ! Learn to hang school bags.

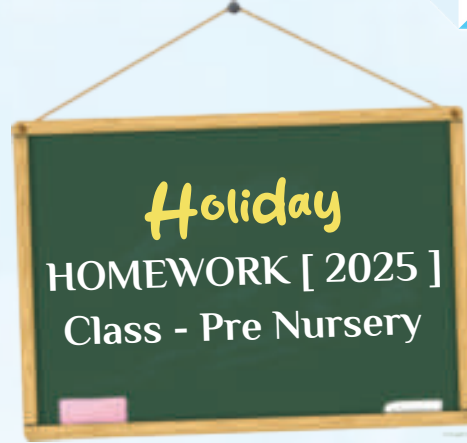


## LEARNING BEYOND BOOKS

## **Gross Motor Skills Development**

Help your child strengthen their muscles and coordination with these fun indoor and outdoor activities!

### **Indoor Gross Motor Activities**

These activities need only a little floor space but offer big benefits!

#### **!Muscle Movement:**

Encourage movement in small spaces. No need for much room!

#### **!Dancing:**

Let children dance freely or follow movement-based songs like:

"I Am Special," "Head, Shoulders, Knees and Toes," "I'm a Little Teapot," "The Wheels on the Bus," or "Popcorn."

#### **!Hopping:**

Create fun jumping targets using masking tape or cardboard to hop from place to place.

### **Outdoor Gross Motor Activities**

With more space outdoors, kids can move freely and build strength through active play.

#### **!Riding:**

Let children ride tricycles, scooters, or other ride-on toys.

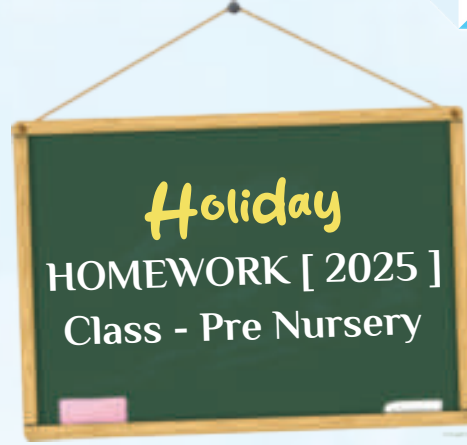
#### **!Playground Fun:**

Swings, slides, ladders, and open running spaces let kids stretch their legs and play with friends.

#### **!Walking Adventures:**

Take a walk in the park or neighbourhood. Make it fun by adding marching, skipping, hopping, or jogging.





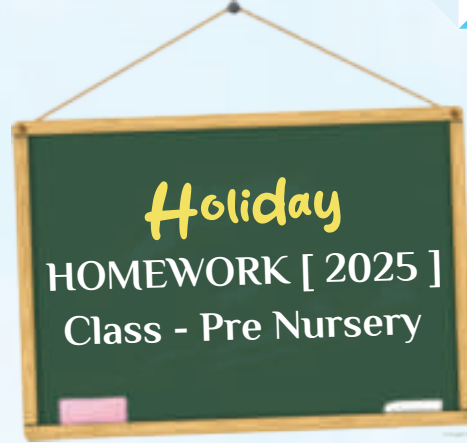
### **Fine Motor Skills Development**

Children at this age are developing important fine motor skills-essential for tasks like holding a pencil, using scissors, feeding themselves, and more.

These activities help strengthen the small muscles in their fingers and hands:

- !Colouring and tracing with crayons, pencils, or markers
- !Cutting using safety scissors
- !Fingerplays like "The Itsy Bitsy Spider" that involve finger and hand movements
- !Lacing cards or stringing beads for coordination
- !Manipulative toys such as blocks, puzzles, or stacking games
- !Puppet shows that encourage hand control
- !Sand play - pouring, scooping, sifting, and building
- !Creative art using sidewalk chalk, finger painting, or clay modelling.

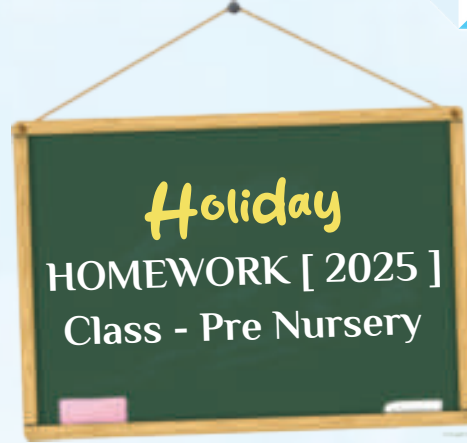
## **Happy** **Father's Day**

##### I - Insect Craft

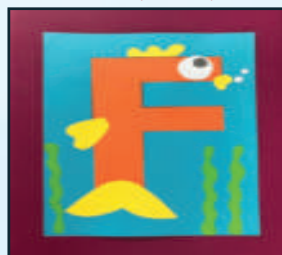
Cut out a big I shape from coloured paper . Paste 6 paper legs, antennae, and wings. Add googly eyes and a smile to make it look like a cute insect!

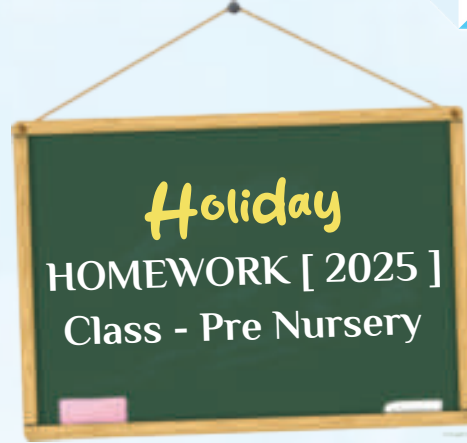


##### F - Fish Craft

Cut out a big F from thick paper. Stick foil paper scales on the F. Add a tail fin, eye, and draw a mouth to complete your shiny fish!







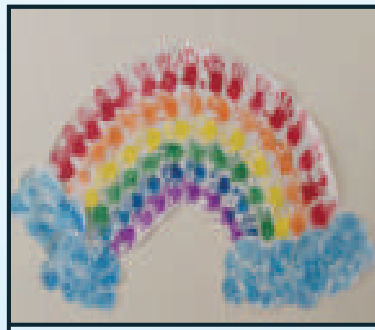
### **Dress-Up Fun:**

Let your little one wear a different coloured outfit each day and learn to name the colour. Don't forget to capture the moment with a cute photo of your colourful star! 🌈📸

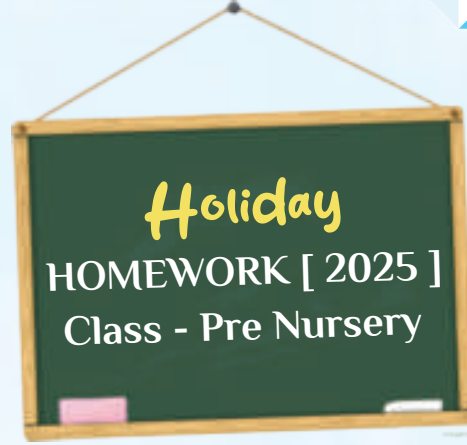


### **Handprint Rainbow:**

I see the sky smiling at me! ☁️

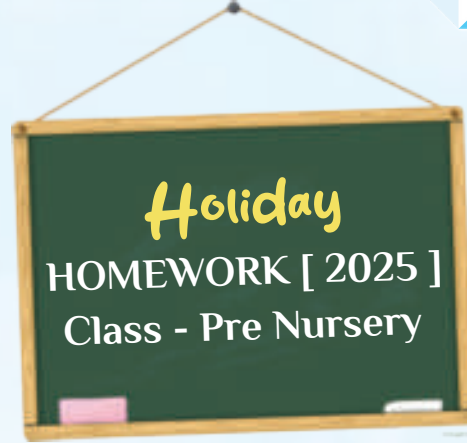

### 1) Finger Painting Shapes

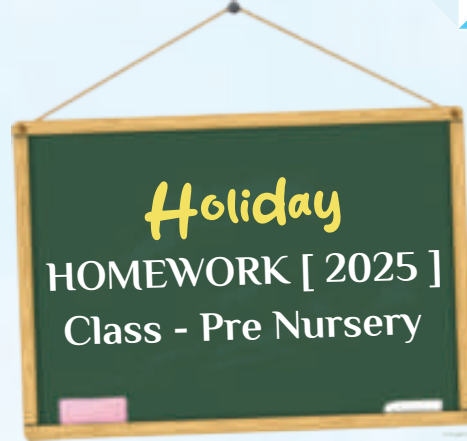
To learn shapes and enjoy colour play. Draw large outlines of basic shapes (circle, square, triangle, and rectangle) on a sheet of paper. Encourage the child to use finger paints to fill in each shape with different colours, promoting shape recognition while enjoying the sensory experience of colour play.



### 2 ) Colour & Count Ballons 🌈

This activity is designed to help children learn colour recognition and practice counting in a fun, hands-on way using colourful balloons. To begin, blow up balloons in different colours such as red, blue, yellow, and green. Spread them around the room or place them together in a basket or tub. Encourage your child to observe and identify balloons of specific colours. Ask questions like, "How many red balloons can you find?", "Can you count the blue ones?", As children search, count, and compare, they build important early math and observation skills playfully and engagingly.

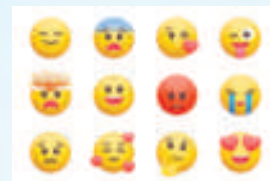




## EVS

### 1. Emoji Faces – Understanding Emotions

This activity helps children recognize and name basic emotions like happy, sad, angry, surprised, and scared. Draw or paste emoji faces on paper using drawings, printouts, or magazine cutouts. Sit with your child, point to each face, and ask them to name the emotion. Encourage them to say it aloud and act it out. This simple activity builds emotional awareness and expression in a fun way.



### 2. Sunshine Craft – “Hello Mr.Sun !”

Children will make a sun by pasting orange or yellow strips around a yellow paper circle to create rays. They can draw a happy face and add sunglasses for a fun summer touch. While crafting, ask simple questions like “Is the sun hot or cold?” and “What do we wear in summer to protect ourselves from the sun?” This activity is a fun way to build creativity and seasonal awareness.



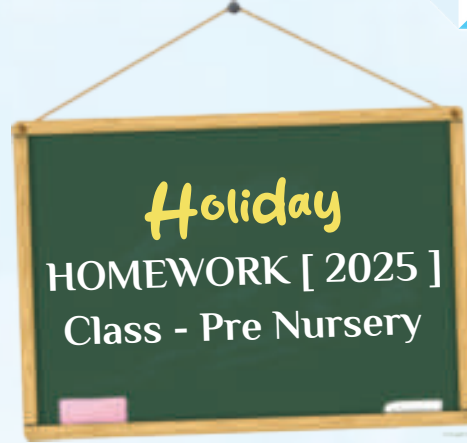
### 3. Special Activity: My Little Plant Friend

Children will plant fast-growing seeds like beans or sunflowers in small pots. They can name their plant and take care of it at home by watering it regularly. When school reopens, they'll bring their plant back and share how it has grown. This activity teaches responsibility and love for nature in a fun way.

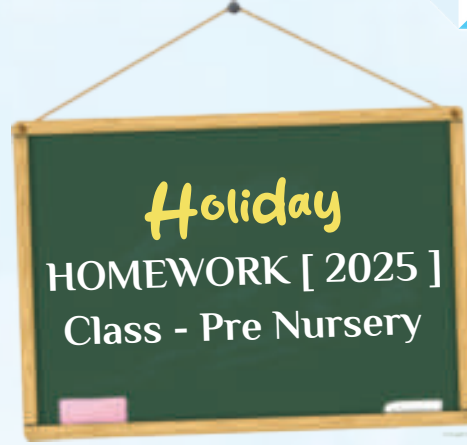
## Trace Standing & Sleeping Lines



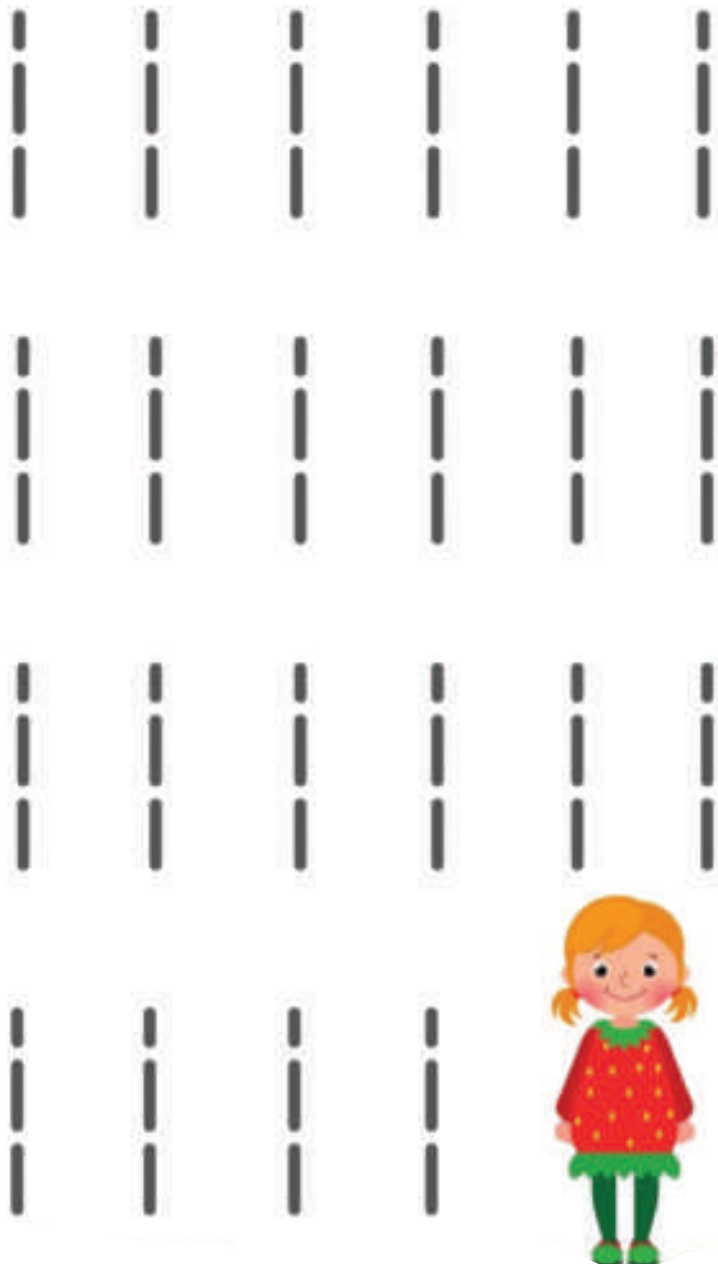
