
A few pointers to help you make the most of your extended summer vacation.

- Avoid sleeping in excess or allowing boredom to rule your life. Keep yourself busy while on vacation.



Example:


The green tree stands so tall and wide,

Its leaves dance gently in the breeze,







2.. प्रकृति की डायरी (Nature Diary)



3 triangles (e.g., leaves, rock shapes)


3 rectangles/squares (e.g., tree bark, twigs arranged)


OR

Task: Identify and draw animals using basic shapes.







1. Giving life to a new plant.

Aim - One plant for our mother Earth .













Procedure- Sow few seeds of tomato or chillies in a pot containing sil and coco peat. Watch its growth after every 10 days and take a picture on every 10th day.

Writing work - Paste it in a A3 size coloured paper mentioning date.

Objective - 1. To learn about plant growth: Understand how plants grow and develop.

- 2. To understand the importance of nutrition: Learn how plants provide us with nutritious food.
- 3. To develop responsibility: Take care of plants and understand the value of nurturing living things.
- 4. To observe and record changes: Track the growth and changes in plants over time.
- 5. To appreciate nature: Develop a love for nature and understand the role of plants in our ecosystem.

2. Visit to a nursery.

Aim - Detect and learn about importance of plants.





Procedure - Visit a nursery and find out different varieties of Tulsi plant and write the information about it in a A4 size paper in the following given way.

Writing work-


- a) Tulsi plant photo

Objective-

- 1. To learn about Tulsi plant: Understand its significance, uses, and benefits.
- 2. To understand plant care: Learn how to plant, water, and care for Tulsi.







- 3. To develop observation skills: Observe different plants and their characteristics.
- 4. To appreciate nature: Develop a love for plants and understand their importance.
- 5. To learn about medicinal plants: Understand the medicinal properties of Tulsi and its uses.

This visit can help students develop curiosity, observation skills, and appreciation for nature!

3. Bird watching and Animal nurturing

Aim- Giving a helping hand to the birds and animals.

Procedure -

[A] Hang a mud pot in your balcony and fill water in it every day for birds. Observe and record the different types of birds you see in your area.





Note their characteristics such as:

- Plumage or colours
- Beak shapes and their feets

[B] Keep a mud pot for animals and keep it outside your home/society.




Writing work- Prepare a journal and write about how did you feel while doing kind work for the birds and animals.

Objectives -

- 1. To understand the importance of kindness: Learn why treating animals with kindness and respect is crucial.
- 2. To develop empathy: Understand and share the feelings of animals, recognizing their needs and emotions.
- 3. To learn about animal care: Discover basic needs of animals, such as food, shelter, and water.
- 4. To promote conservation: Understand the role humans play in protecting animals and their habitats.
- 5. To take action: Participate in simple activities that help animals, such as making bird feeders or planting trees.

COMPUTER

1. Theme:

Your poster should visually represent:

- Types of pollution (air, water, land)
- Effects of urban development and deforestation
- Impact on nature (animals, forests, oceans)
- Simple solutions (recycling, planting trees, using less plastic)

2. Design Guidelines:

- Drawings/Sketches (trees, smoke, animals, factories, rivers, etc.)
- Short Labels or Slogans (e.g., "Save Trees, Save Life")
- Use **text tool** to write headings or key messages
- Use different colours to show good vs. bad actions (green for nature, grey/black for pollution)

3. What to Include:

- A title at the top (e.g., "Save Our Planet!")
- At least 3 harmful human actions shown
- At least 2 solutions shown
- Your name and class written clearly in a corner

4. Submission:

- Save your file as: YourName_Class_EnvironmentPoster.png
- Submit a soft copy of your drawing to your subject teacher.


ART AND CRAFT
